I lament the sad loss of Julianne Bell, my friend, one of the greatest carers of Victoria and lover of this state's beauty and history. She fought against all who tried to further destroy or dismiss the wonderful history and growth of Melbourne and Victoria. Never will Royal Park return to the beauty she fought so long to save.

Her fight for our recently destroyed historic elms exemplifies her caring. We may never know whose decision caused their crass death.

I remember for ever the 1990s, as Julianne and I fought together to save Mont Park. This hospital for our seriously mentally ill (SMI) was, indeed, the best hospital which has ever been given to our SMI in the last 30 years. Mont Park had fine buildings, many trees, beautiful grounds and gardens. This was my daughter's first, and only, comfortable shelter for her mental illness. Never again did she find such peace and the very best of psychiatric care.

Julianne fought desperately, in every way she knew, to stop the sale of Mont Park in order for it to be used for the Games coming to Melbourne. Our SMI and Julianne lost. I am eternally grateful that she showed such courage and caring. Those who destroyed this refuge for our SMI did not.

Julianne kept rising, year after year, to continue to fight for our history, our state's beauty, our Victorians.
